Sample Text

A child's development varies from family to family, but there are incidences when their behaviour is seen to deviate from the norm. Researchers have found a positive correlation between a child whose parents often speak to them from a young age, and the speed of their vocal development. There are of course extremes at both ends of the range, where we see children whose parents rarely interact with their offspring and, as a result, learn to speak at a much later age. Reliable evidence shows that babies tend to star their vocal development at the age of around 6-9 months, when they begin to try and communicate with others around them. At that age, babies tend towards familiar adults and shy away from strangers. This is consistent with their new-found awareness of the world around them. A certain proportion of babies at the age of 1 year will already be able to say a few simple words, however the ratio of those who take several more months to begin vocalising properly is much larger. Due to the sheer volume of words in the English language, it is hardly surprising that some babies take many months to develop their speech faculties successfully.

Glossary

1) to deviate from the norm

to be different from, or do something in a different way from what is usual or expected

- While the term "nontraditional" connotes an image of a student who **deviates from the norm**, research shows that most community college students are nontraditional in some sense, and, therefore, are the norm for their environment.
- In recent years, the practice of music therapy has expanded to include service to groups that, while not traditionally included among the handicapped, still deviate from the norm in some substantial way.
- This is not surprising as it is well established that higher status athletes are given more latitude to **deviate from the norm** (respectful behavior toward a game official) than are

those of lesser status (though the high school federation rule book makes no such distinction).

2) to correlate with (correlation)

to be closely connected to and affect or depend on something

- A high-fat diet **correlates with** a greater risk of heart disease.
- Anatomical changes in the brain are **correlated with** predictable effects on behavior.
- In the study discussed here, cosmic ray density data were **correlated with** the U.S. infant mortality rate.

3) extremes of the range

the largest or smallest element in a range of values

- The average size of a South Sea pearl is 13mm, with the **extremes in a range** of sizes from 9mm up to 20mm.
- Music for the French horn which includes very quiet passages should not be written for the top or bottom extremes of the instrument's range.
- In the extremes of the range, the night winter temperatures may drop to a dry 32 degrees Fahrenheit (= 0 degrees Celsius).

4) to show (indicate) a tendency

to be likely to behave or act in a particular way

- Using a field systems analysis methodology, the investigator was able to **show a tendency** of the urban teacher to focus on management while the suburban teacher emphasized instructional outcomes more than his counterpart.
- The slower pace of unloading the stance leg (p<0.01) in amputees, together with the previous results, **indicate a tendency** for slower and more careful gait.
- Furthermore, there was a **tendency** for student responses to be more polarized in online courses than in traditional, face-to-face courses (Riffell and Sibley, 2005).

5) Reliable

able to be trusted to do something well; able to be relied upon. Or, likely to be correct or true

- Equally important is the need to create a **reliable** judicial process that will prosecute captured pirates and impose sentences that will signal to ordinary Somalis that piracy is no longer a livelihood with great rewards and few costs.
- How **reliable** is the recent finding that happy, optimistic people tend to live longer than those who see the world, in A. E. Housman's phrase, " for ill and not for good "?

6) Consistent

always behaving in the same way, or having the same opinions, standards, etc; or, not contradicting something

- Junior high students reported increased satisfaction and exhibited better test results when placed in classrooms with teachers whom they identified as **consistent** and fair in their discipline techniques.
- Contestants in four Olympic combat sports were randomly assigned red or blue outfits; for all four competitions, there were consistent and statistically significant patterns in which contestants wearing red won more fights.
- The mortality rates represented in the Carthage cemetery are **consistent** with prenatal and infant mortality figures found in present-day societies.

7) to show a trend

to exhibit a change or development in a general direction

- Using a cut-off point of less or more than 10 pack years of smoking, increased prevalence of chronic cough showed a trend toward smoking of more than 10 pack years.
- Overall, the results of the open-ended questions show a trend for The University of Georgia students to own at least one of the brand-name apparel products in the study.
- Even a cursory review of the history of public school music in this century will **show a trend** toward a de-emphasis on singing in the last twenty-five years or so, particularly for those students not enrolled in performance-oriented vocal groups.

8) ratio vs proportion

ratio: the relationship between two groups of people or things that is represented by two numbers showing how much larger one group is relative to the other

- A **ratio** must be specifically stated— if there is a class with 6 girls and 4 boys, the ratio of girls to boys is 6:4 or 3:2. The ratio of girls to the class is 6:10 or 3/5.
- His data suggest that the **ratio** of civilian deaths to tons of ordnance dropped has actually increased in the past 20 years, as precision weapons have been introduced in greater numbers.

proportion: this number tells the size of a part or share relative to a whole

- Water covers a large proportion of the earth's surface.
- Loam is a soil with roughly equal **proportions** of clay, sand and silt.
- A higher **proportion** of Americans go on to higher education than is the case in Britain.
- If there is a class of 6 girls and 4 boys, the **proportion** of girls is 6/10 or 3/5 (of the class).

9) an increase in the volume of

• The U.S. intelligence community has received a substantial **increase in the volume of** threat-related intelligence reports.

- Scientists can not pinpoint the exact cause for the rise but they hypothesize that a natural **increase in the volume of** water discharged by the Volga, the main river that flows into the Caspian, has played a role.
- The dramatic **increase in the volume of** immigration to the United States has left a distinct impression on the student populations of many community colleges.
- As age advances, there is a tendency to increase in the volume of hypothalamic area and consequently decrease in the neuron density.¹
